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FOREWORD TO THE TREASURER'S STATEMENT

1. General Comments

The law relating to the finances of the State of Victoria is contained in the Constitution Act, the Audit Act and the Public Account Act.

The Constitution Act creates the Consolidated Revenue and makes its appropriation the prerogative of Parliament. It also establishes the requirement that any money bill must be preceded by a message from the Governor, and that expenditure may be incurred only on warrants from the Governor.

The Audit Act relates to the financial administration of moneys coming into the hands of the Government; the collection, management and expenditure of, and the subsequent accounting for, these moneys, public property and other property. It covers the audit of public accounts, including departmental accounts and the reporting to Parliament by the Auditor-General on the Treasurer's Statement.

The Public Account Act defines the scope of the Consolidated Fund and the Trust Fund, the balances of which are held in the Government's bank account—the Public Account. The Trust Fund includes the Works and Services Account, the Cash Management Account and the State Development Account. The Cash Management Account and the State Development Account form the Victorian Development Fund. The Public Account Act also permits the use of the Public Account for temporary advances for a number of purposes related to the needs of the Government and provides for investment of the Public Account in trustee securities. Provision is also made for temporary borrowings should the Consolidated Fund be insufficient to meet commitments during a financial year.

2. Treasurer's Statement

Section 46 of the Audit Act requires the Treasurer, not later than three months after the end of the financial year, to prepare a detailed statement of the receipts into, and expenditure from, the Consolidated Fund and the Trust Fund in the financial year and to transmit it to the Auditor-General.

In practice, the Treasurer's Statement is produced on a progressive basis and verified by the officers of the Audit Office. When the Statement is completed and signed by the Treasurer, it is available to accompany the report of the Auditor-General in terms of section 47 of the Audit Act for presentation to Parliament.

Broadly, the Treasurer's Statement for the 1984-85 financial year comprises—

A.—At page 1; a statement of the balances of the State of Victoria as at 30 June 1985. This statement shows the aggregate transactions of and the balances of the Consolidated Fund and the Trust Fund, less certain advances from the Public Account (in terms of the Public Account Act) and how these balances were held in the form of bank balances and investments.

B.—Details of the year's receipts and payments in the Consolidated Fund.

The Consolidated Fund receipts as set out in Section 4 of the Public Account Act comprises the Consolidated Revenue under the Constitution Act and all moneys received by the State under the Commonwealth and States' Financial Agreement Acts. It also includes grants from the Commonwealth, amounts received from the sale of property and the repayment of loans made from the Works and Services Account.

Payments from the Consolidated Fund are appropriated by Parliament by virtue of the Constitution Act. There are two types of appropriation—Special and Annual. Special Appropriations exist in legislation which appropriates the Consolidated Fund for specific purposes and are of a continuing nature. These are set out in detail on pages 22-24. Annual Appropriations are those appropriations passed by Parliament which are incorporated in the Appropriation Act for the supply of funds and services for a financial year. This financial year the Annual Appropriation Act introduced, for the first time, program budgetting in its entirety which replaced the old format of showing line items under Divisions and Sub-divisions. The Act also introduced the means by which the Treasurer can approve the transfer of allocations from one program to another within a Ministry. In addition, the Act included, also for the first time, Works and Services allocations. This new arrangement means that both Recurrent and Works and Services expenditure approved by the Treasurer "From Treasurer's Advance" are shown in column 3. Included under Program 729 is an amount that enables the Treasurer to meet urgent claims. Details are submitted to Parliament for sanction in the following financial year as a schedule to the annual Appropriation Act. Set out on pages 25-170 are the amounts appropriated by Parliament and the details of expenditure under Program 729 for each department. Funds to enable the Treasurer to meet urgent claims may also be provided temporarily out of the Public Account under Section 16 of the Public Account Act and are subject to Parliamentary appropriation in the following year. These are also set out on pages 25-170.

- C.—In respect of the Trust Fund, details of receipts into and payments from, and the balances of the various funds and accounts which make up the Trust Fund, classified into a number of categories; a list of the amounts of individual trust accounts which are invested, and details of the securities held by Trust Accounts.
- D.—Appendices showing details of the Capital Liability of the State of Victoria to the Commonwealth of Australia (Appendices 1-4), details of loans raised by the Capital Works Authority (Appendix 5), details of the liability of the State in relation to borrowings from the State Development Account (Appendix 6), Equity Capital held by the State (Appendix 7), details of Loan Repayments (Appendices 8 and 9), advances from the Public Account (Appendix 10), an abridged statement of the Agent-General's Account (Appendix 11), and the contingent liability of the Government under guarantees of loans, borrowings, etc. (Appendices 12 and 13).

The above statement summarises the financial transactions in the Consolidated Fund for the 1984-85 financial year. At 30 June 1985, a balance of \$27.7 million was held in the Consolidated Fund, reflecting a surplus on transactions in the current account in 1984-85 almost equal to the surplus carried forward from 1983-84. Broadly speaking, this surplus resulted from stronger growth than expected in economic activity, and hence in some recurrent receipts. Reflecting particular economic developments, some revenue items showed exceptional growth in 1984-85 which is not likely to be repeated in 1985-86.

In aggregate, recurrent revenue totalled \$7202.0 million, higher than the Budget estimates by \$81.1 million, Receipts from most of the larger items of State taxation where higher than budgeted due to somewhat stronger growth in activity than expected. As mentioned in the Treasurer's monthly statements, receipts from stamp duties on land transfers were particularly buoyant. However, the Budget estimate was also exceeded in respect of receipts from pay-roll tax, Tattersalls duty, petroleum franchise fees and other stamp duties. In total, State taxation receipts were \$138.6 million higher than the Budget estimate. In addition, receipts from oil royalties exceeded the Budget estimate by \$17.5 million due to a higher than forecast level of oil production, and, in the latter part of the year, higher prices resulting from the Commonwealth Government's import parity pricing policy.

There were two offsets, among State sources of revenue, to this higher than expected level of receipts in taxation and oil royalties. First, the Budget estimate for recoveries of debt charges included an estimate of \$50 million for recall of advances previously made to statutory authorities; a lesser amount of \$15 million was recalled. Second, the public authority dividend paid by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria (SECV) was \$70 million, rather than the amount of \$126 million included in the Budget estimates. During 1984–85, the real cost of debt to the SECV was greater than expected when the Budget figure was estimated because of the higher than expected level of interest rates and the devaluation of the Australian dollar during the year. Recurrent receipts from Commonwealth Government sources totalled \$2821.3 million, exceeding the Budget estimate by \$7 million. Taking State and Commonwealth sources together total revenue on current account was 1.1 per cent more than the Budget estimate.

Recurrent expenditure on items included in the Budget estimates was slightly lower than expected. However, total recurrent expenditure was affected by higher spending than expected in two items, although in both cases higher spending was balanced by higher revenue. The first was higher spending on hospitals arising from the increased usage of public hospitals under Medicare. This was offset on the revenue side by higher Medicare receipts from the Commonwealth Government. The second was a refund of stamp duties in respect of corporate reconstructions received as revenue during the year. In addition, an amount of \$45 million was deposited in the Cash Management Account of the Victorian Development Fund. This deposit was in addition to the repayment, included in the Budget estimates, of \$40.6 million to the Cash Management Account being the final instalment of the repayment, over two years, of the borrowing in 1982–83.

In total, recurrent expenditures amounted to \$7202.4 million. If the additional Medicare and stamp duty payments, which were offset by additional receipts, and the deposit in the Cash Management Account are excluded, in order to produce figures comparable in coverage with the Budget estimates, recurrent expenditures were 0.3 per cent lower than the Budget estimates.

Works and services expenditure was \$1625.3 million, which was 91.2 per cent of the Budget estimate. The most significant portion of the total shortfall of \$157.2 million in spending was concentrated in spending from the Capital Development Fund. Of the \$65 million allocated in the Budget to the Major Initiatives Program, only \$20 million was expended. It should be noted that the possible carryforward of a balance in this program was envisaged when the Budget was prepared. This program was established to fund initiatives which might reach the implementation stage during the year. In addition, due to the better than expected recovery in the private sector, spending on a number of projects in the State Development Program proceeded at a slower rate than expected when the Budget estimates were made.

Given this shortfall in expenditure, the amount drawn down from the State Development Account and the transfer of funds from the Works and Services Account into the Consolidated Fund were less than the figure included in the Budget estimates.

4. Accounting Policies and Practice

There are two generally accepted bases of accounting. One is the cash basis, by which income is taken into account in the period it is received and expenditure is accounted for when the actual disbursement is made. The other is the accrual basis under which revenue is brought to account as it is earned or due (even if not collected) and expenditure is recorded when a liability is incurred (whether payment is made during the period or not). Some systems use elements of both bases. In most Westminster Parliamentary systems, as in Victoria, the basis of accounting is the cash basis.

The Treasurer's Statement is prepared on a cash basis, with the exception of accounting for salaries, wages and pensions, in respect of which account is taken of the incurred cost of these items for the full year. This is done by bringing to account at the end of the financial year the cost of the salaries, etc., represented in the number of days from the end of the last pay period in a year to 30 June. The amount involved is credited to the Salaries and Wages in Suspense Account in the Trust Fund, from which the appropriate payments are made in the following year.

Pursuant to the requirements of the Annual Reporting Act 1983 and its associated regulations, an annual report for each Administrative Unit is required to be presented to the Parliament at about the same time as the presentation of the Treasurer's Statement. The Administrative Unit annual reports include detailed financial statements of receipts and expenditure from all sources including Consolidated Fund and Trust Fund transactions. The Treasurer's Statement is the consolidation of the Consolidated Fund and Trust Fund transactions of each and every Administrative Unit and in this sense the Treasurer's Statement and Administrative Unit annual reports are complementary.

The Administrative Unit annual reports are certified by the Chief Administrator and principal accounting officer of each Administrative Unit and are audited by the Auditor-General as required by the Annual Reporting Act 1983.

The total of receipts and payments in each of the Administrative Unit annual reports will differ from aggregates in "Finance" because of some inter-agency transactions. The Administrative Unit financial statements also include certain non-cash accounting items which are not included in "Finance".

The Comptroller-General is currently reviewing accounting policies for the Public Account and their relationship to the accounting policies for Administrative Units pursuant to the *Annual Reporting Act* 1983.

Appropriation under the 1984-85 Annual Appropriation Act has, for the first time, been made to link items under Programs rather than the old format of line items under Divisions and Sub-divisions. The transition to program appropriation is a further stage in the Government's strategy for the introduction of program budgeting. Program reporting elsewhere in Australia and overseas is generally by way of supplementary statements to the formal financial statements. Therefore, the adoption of program appropriation and reporting in Victoria is an important initiative designed to ensure that the benefits of program budgeting flow through all elements of financial management, including the State's audited financial statements.

These changes have placed considerable demands on the systems for managing the Public Account within the Comptroller-General's Division. For this reason a new EDP system, based on in-house Prime mini-computer equipment, was introduced early in 1984-85 and commenced "live running" in October 1984. During 1984-85 the system has been subjected to extensive internal and external review including a review by the Auditor-General. As a result, the Comptroller-General is satisfied that the system is a more than adequate tool for managing the Public Account in the program budgeting environment. However, the system and its associated administrative procedures will continue to be improved and upgraded during 1985-86.

5. National Accounting

The Treasurer's Statement is prepared in accordance with section 46 of the Audit Act which requires the preparation of statements for the Consolidated Fund and the Trust Fund. Although this fulfills legal requirements, it poses some problems with respect to showing the net transactions of the Public Account. Addition of Consolidated Fund and Trust Fund transactions will not give a correct overall picture of the Public Account as there are a number of internal transactions, as well as double counting, through the use of suspense and accounting type trust accounts.

For this reason and in keeping with the Government's stated philosophy of increased accountability to Parliament through better reporting, a supporting statement, namely the National Accounting Statement of Receipts and Outlays of the Consolidated Fund and Trust Fund 1980-81 to 1984-85 is incorporated in this "Foreword to the Treasurer's Statement". See Tables 1 and 2.

It must be stressed that these tables do not form part of "Finance—The Treasurer's Statement", they are not audited and are published for information purposes only.

The receipts and outlays of the Consolidated Fund and Trust Fund are classified according to the national accounting format to enable broad types of expenditure and revenue to be identified on a basis consistent with information provided by the Australian Statistician in the publication "Government Financial Estimates".

These transactions are treated on two separate bases—classification according to "economic type" and by "purpose". These bases can be contrasted with the conventional classification of the "Estimates of the Receipts and Payments of the Consolidated Fund and the "Works Programs" which reflect the Ministerial basis of control and responsibility for funds appropriated to various departments.

* The economic type classification is shown in Table 1. Items of expenditure are classified according to four main categories—consumption, capital, transfers and advances. Receipts are identified separately for taxation, advances and grants from the Commonwealth, property income and other items.

* The purpose classification of total net outlays (Table 2) follows the definitions adopted by the Australian Statistician. While the allocation of items between various functions has been undertaken with the assistance of the Australian Bureau of Statistics, the apportionment between areas is, in a few cases, necessarily somewhat arbitrary and further development and refinement of the various classifications is continuing.

The functional classification is provided for all categories on a "net" basis, as fees and charges for example have been deducted from gross expenditures. While this measures the net impact of government expenditure, it does lead to a significant reduction in reported activity in areas where there are significant user-charges, such as the Corporate Affairs area (shown under Other General Economic Services). In the case of State financial and trading enterprises, such as the State Transport Authority, operating revenue is offset against expenditure.

Tables 1 and 2 are presented on a consolidated basis so that amounts transferred between the Consolidated Fund and the Trust Fund, such as the appropriation for Works and Services expenditure and the contribution to the Hospitals and Charities Fund are eliminated so as to reflect net transactions of the budget with the rest of the economy.

The total receipts and payments from tables 1 and 2 differ from aggregates in "Finance" because of the amalgamation of the Consolidated Fund with the Trust Fund and the consequent elimination of inter-fund transfers.

Certain Commonwealth grants to Victoria and the expenditure therefrom have been classified to a special category—"Commonwealth Grants for Onpassing" in those cases where the State's only function is to transfer these funds on to other institutions not controlled by the State Government.
