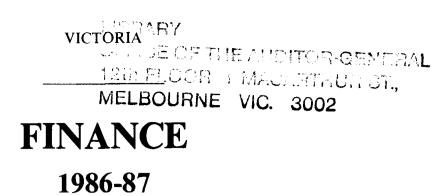

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## **Explanatory Notes**

#### **NOTES TO THE TREASURER'S STATEMENT**

#### 1. General Comments

The law relating to the finances of the State of Victoria is contained in the Constitution Act, the Audit Act and the Public Account Act.

The Constitution Act creates the Consolidated Revenue and makes its appropriation the prerogative of Parliament. It also establishes the requirement that any money bill must be preceded by a message from the Governor, and that expenditure may be incurred only on warrants from the Governor.

The Audit Act relates to the financial administration of moneys coming into the hands of the Government; the collection, management and expenditure of, and the subsequent accounting for, these moneys, public property and other property. It covers the audit of public accounts, including departmental accounts, and the reporting to Parliament by the Auditor-General on the Treasurer's Statement.

The Public Account Act defines the scope of the Consolidated Fund and the Trust Fund, the balances of which are held in the Government's bank account the Public Account. The Trust Fund includes the Works and Services Account, the Cash Management Account and the State Development Account. The Cash Management Account and the State Development Account form the Victorian Development Fund. The Public Account Act also permits the use of the Public Account for temporary advances for a number of purposes related to the needs of the Government and provides for investment of the Public Account in trustee securities. Provision is also made for temporary borrowings should the Consolidated Fund be insufficient to meet commitments during a financial year.

#### 2. Treasurer's Statement

Section 46 of the Audit Act requires the Treasurer, not later than three months after the end of the financial year, to prepare a detailed statement of the receipts into, and expenditure from, the Consolidated Fund and the Trust Fund in the financial year and to transmit it to the Auditor-General.

Continuing the practice introduced last year, all amounts defined in the Treasurer's Statement are expressed in \$'000. This change is one of a number of new initiatives introduced to improve the presentation of financial statements.

In practice, the Treasurer's Statement is produced on a progressive basis and verified by the officers of the Audit Office. When the Statement is completed and signed by the Treasurer, it is available to accompany the report of the Auditor-General in terms of section 47 of the Audit Act for presentation to Parliament.

Broadly, the Treasurer's Statement for the 1986-87 financial year comprises-

A.—At page 1: a statement of the balances of the State of Victoria as at 30 June 1987. This statement shows the aggregate transactions of and the balances of the Consolidated Fund and the Trust Fund, less certain advances from the Public Account (in terms of the Public Account Act) and how these balances were held in the form of bank balances and investments. B.—Details of the year's receipts and payments in the Consolidated Fund.

The Consolidated Fund receipts as set out in section 4 of the Public Account Act comprise the Consolidated Revenue under the Constitution Act and all moneys received by the State under the Commonwealth and States' Financial Agreement Acts. It also includes grants from the Commonwealth, amounts received from the sale of property and the repayment of loans made from the Works and Services Account.

Payments from the Consolidated Fund are appropriated by Parliament by virtue of the Constitution Act. There are two types of appropriation-Special and Annual. Special Appropriations exist in legislation which appropriates moneys out of the Consolidated Fund for specific purposes and are of a continuing nature. These are set out in detail on pages 24-26. Annual Appropriations are those appropriations passed by Parliament which are incorporated in the Appropriation Act for the supply of funds to meet approved recurrent and works and services expenditure for a financial year. Since the formal adoption of program budgeting by the Government in 1984-85 appropriation legislation, Parliamentary appropriations have been made to Ministry programs. The Annual Appropriation Act also provides the authority for the Treasurer to approve the transfer of allocations from one program to another within a Ministry. Recurrent and Works and Services expenditure approved by the Treasurer "From Treasurer's Advance" are shown in column 5. Included under Program 729 is an amount that enables the Treasurer to meet urgent claims. Details are submitted to Parliament for approval in the following financial year as a schedule to the Annual Appropriation Act. Set out on pages 27-121 are the amounts appropriated by Parliament and the details of expenditure under Program 729 for each department. Funds to enable the Treasurer to meet urgent claims may also be provided temporarily out of the Public Account under section 16 of the Public Account Act and are subject to Parliamentary appropriation in the following year. These are also set out on pages 27-121.

Details of transfers made under section 10 of the Appropriation Act are included in the payments from the Consolidated Fund. These are shown in column 2 on pages 27–121 and show all variations to the Parliamentary Authority under the respective programs. A further statement of transfers by agency will be found on pages 117–120.

- C.—In respect of the Trust Fund, details are given of receipts into and payments from the trust fund together with the balances of the various funds and accounts which make up the Trust Fund, classified into a number of categories. A list of the amounts of individual trust accounts which are invested, and details of the securities held by Trust Accounts, are also included.
- D.—A major reform of the Finance Statement has been made in the Supplementary Information consistent with improvements in reporting and suggestions by the Auditor-General. These include reporting expenditure by program whether from Annual or Special Appropriations, on the Trust Fund, inclusion of a summary of Public Debt and the inclusion of summarised asset and liability information. This information is contained in the tables on pages 136-144.

#### 3. Budget Out-turn for Financial Year

The table below shows in summary form actual receipts and payments on the Consolidated Fund for the year ended 30 June 1987, as well as budgeted amounts.

(1) Certain expenditures met during the 1986-87 financial year as Special Appropriations pursuant to section 4 (3) of the *Public Account Act* 1958, were recorded as annual appropriations in Table B1 of Budget Paper No. 5 in accordance with normal practice, because they will be met from Annual Appropriations in 1987-88. In the above table they appear as Special Appropriations. These expenditures totalled: Recurrent, \$4 522 454 and Works and Services, \$2 150 278.

(2) In accordance with normal practice Budget estimates for recurrent annual appropriations do not include allowance for payments in respect of wage awards which may be handed down during the year. These accounts total \$76-1 M in 1986-87 and are included in the recurrent appropriations of the respective Ministries as detailed in the abstract on pages 27—121. The total for recurrent annual appropriations including Section 4 (2) appropriations for 1986-87 is \$7049-3 M.

Financial transactions in the Consolidated Fund in 1986–87 were in balance, as shown above.

#### 4. Current Account Receipts

#### 4.1 Summary of Current Account Receipts

In his 1986-87 Budget the Treasurer estimated that total current account receipts would be \$8419.2 million. Actual receipts during the year were \$8556.1 million—\$136.9 million or 1.6 per cent above the Budget forecast.

Table A.1 compares actual current account receipts in 1986–87 with the Budget estimates.

Some of the major variations in revenue collections are discussed below. Further details on receipts from individual items can be found in the 1987–88 Budget Paper No. 4.

#### 4.2 Taxation Receipts

Total receipts from State Taxation in 1986–87 were \$3400.5 million—\$104.8 million above the Budget forecast. Some of the major variations from Budget estimates are shown in the following table:

#### 4.2.1 Payroll Tax

Receipts from Pay-roll tax in 1986-87 were \$1264.7 million—\$20.2 million or 1.6 per cent below the Budget estimate. This variation reflects lower than anticipated increases in earnings and employment for the Pay-roll Tax base.

#### 4.2.2 Stamp Duties

The area of greatest variation from the Budget estimate of receipts was in the area of stamp duty. In aggregate, revenue from stamp duties was \$125.4 million or 17.0 per cent above the Budget estimate of collections.

This overrun reflected, in the main, strong growth in the property and share markets.

Receipts from stamp duty on land transfers were \$424.3 million in 1986-87— \$67.4 million higher than collections in 1985-86. Activity in the property market was at a very high level and although the volume of transactions was only slightly more than that of the previous year the average price of properties grew strongly. In particular the transfer of a significant number of commercial and industrial properties, especially in the CBD, had a significant impact on revenue collections during 1986-87.

Revenue from stamp duty on share market transactions was \$149.5 million— \$55.2 million higher than in 1985–86. The increase in revenue from this source reflects the buoyancy of the share market throughout 1986–87.

4.2.3 Other Taxation Revenues

Revenue from Tattersalls duty exceeded the Budget forecast by \$8.6 million. The growth in revenue of \$30 million between 1985–86 and 1986–87 reflected a steady recovery in receipts from Saturday night lotto following a decline in 1985–86 and high growth in subscriptions to mid-week lotto.

Land Tax receipts exceeded the Budget forecast by \$2.8 million, reflecting a greater recovery of outstanding tax by the Land Tax Office than estimated. Receipts from Tobacco Licence Fees were \$113.4 million or \$5.9 million less than the Budget estimate. This shortfall reflects a lower consumption of tobacco products than anticipated and some evasion and avoidance of duty.

Other State taxes were largely on target with the Budget forecasts.

4.3 Other State Sources of Revenue

In aggregate, sources of State revenue other than taxation, into the current account were \$1762.1 million-\$11.4 million or 0.7 per cent above the Budget forecast. Comments on some of the major variations from Budget forecasts are contained below.

4.3.1 Recoveries of Debt

Actual receipts under this heading of revenue were \$329.5 million in 1986–87— \$18.9 million less than the Budget forecast of \$348.4 million. This shortfall was, in the main, the result of—

- lower than anticipated recoveries under the State Development program;
- the recall of only \$25 million from statutory authorities instead of a Budget forecast of \$30 million.

#### 4.3.2 Petroleum Royalties

Receipts from Petroleum Royalties in 1986–87 were \$147.2 million—\$15.4 million higher than the Budget forecast. The overrun reflected a steady improvement in world oil prices over the course of the year and a greater than anticipated level of production.

#### 4.3.3 Revenue from Fees and Charges

Total receipts from Departmental fees and charges in 1986-87 were \$305.3 million-\$6.6 million or 2.2 per cent greater than the Budget forecast.

The growth in receipts from fees and charges during 1986-87 reflects the operation of the following factors—

- an increase in fee levels in accordance with the annual directive which specifies a guideline increase. In 1986–87 the guideline increase was 7 per cent;
- a growth in demand for services, particularly those provided by the Titles Office and the Corporate Affairs Office;
- a greater recovery of administrative on-costs by Departments;
- some increases in fee levels beyond the guideline limit, e.g. for Corporate Affairs where fee levels are fixed by interstate agreement.

#### 4.3.4 Miscellaneous Revenues

Total receipts under the heading of Miscellaneous Revenues were \$159.9 million in 1986-87-\$4.9 million or 3.2 per cent greater than the Budget forecast.

Receipts from interest on public account were \$9.8 million—\$18.2 million less than the Budget forecast. The shortfall reflected smaller monthly cash balances in the public account throughout the year arising because of changes in the timing of receipts and payments relative to those of previous years which were not reflected in the Budget estimates. In 1986–87, a greater concentration of receipts occurred in the later part of the financial year and a greater concentration of payments in the earlier part of the year, compared to the monthly pattern in previous years. This resulted in monthly shortfalls until the later part of the year and thereby reduced interest earnings.

There was also a substantial increase in the recoup of superannuation pensions, mainly because of a greater number of government employees taking advantage of the early retirement scheme and a greater efficiency in ensuring recoupment from agencies.

#### 4.3.5 Receipts from Commonwealth Sources

Total current account receipts from Commonwealth sources were \$3393.6 million in 1986-87-\$20.8 million above the Budget forecast of \$3372.8 million.

The largest single receipt into the Consolidated Fund from the Commonwealth is the Financial Assistance Grant paid to Victoria. At the 1985 Premiers Conference it was agreed that in each of 1986–87 and 1987–88 Financial Assistance Grants payable to all States would be increased by two per cent in real terms. States also received identified health grants based on the two per cent real growth factor. The 1986–87 grants were determined in accordance with these arrangements but different arrangments apply in 1987–88.

The measure used in the calculation of 1986–87 Financial Assistance grants and Health grants was the increase in the Consumer Price Index for the six capital cities in the four quarters to March 1987. The Budget estimates were based on the assumption that the Consumer Price Index would increase by 8.25 per cent. The actual increase was 9.14 per cent. As a result receipts from Financial Assistance and identified Health grants were \$18.7 million and \$3.1 million above the Budget levels respectively. Receipts under the Medicare agreement were \$265.7 million—\$3.4 million below the Budget forecast. This shortfall arose because the index which is used in the calculation of grants was revised downwards in the light of lower than anticipated award earnings.

In aggregate, other current account receipts from Commonwealth sources were largely on target with the Budget estimates.

#### 4.3.6 Works and Services Receipts

Works and services receipts totalled \$1920.4 million compared to a budget estimate of \$1974.3 million, a downward variation from budget of \$53.9 million. The major sources of variation were an excess of \$11.8 million in respect of sale of assets and a transfer from the Works and Services Account which was less than budgeted by \$67.2 million. The former reflects earlier than expected cash flow from the budgeted sale of assets. The latter reflects lower than budgeted works and services payments. The budget sector's global limit borrowing allocation of \$853.1 million in 1986–87 was fully taken up. This borrowing is paid into the Works and Services Account, and transferred as required to the Consolidated Fund to meet works and services expenditure. Because works and services payments were lower than budgeted, the transfer to the Consolidated Fund was lower than budgeted. As a consequence, the balance in the Works and Services Account rose by \$22.4 million to \$73.7 million on 30 June 1987.

#### 5. Payments

#### 5.1 Special Appropriations

Special appropriations exceeded the Budget estimate by \$75.4 million. The main areas in which payments exceeded the Budget estimate were pensions (\$37.4 million), and interest on Cash Management Account borrowings (\$12.5 million). In addition, borrowings during the year included an element of accrued interest (\$11.4 million), for which no allowance had been made in the Budget estimates.

The overrun in respect of pensions was as a result of a far larger than forecast number of early retirements and the cost of the commutation of pensions.

During the year temporary borrowings from the Cash Management Account for liquidity management purposes were higher than expected. This resulted from a greater than expected concentration of payments in the earlier part of the year and a greater than expected concentration of receipts in the later part of the year. As a result, interest payments on these borrowings were greater than budgeted.

Since 1985–86, certain loan raisings by budget sector authorities have included an accrued interest component. This arises from the increasingly frequent practice in financial markets of issuing loans *cum* interest, that is, a full six months interest payment is due on a loan at the first six monthly interest date, regardless of the fact that the security has been on issue for less than six months. When an element of accrued interest is included in borrowings, it is recorded as a receipt, and the repayment is made by way of a Special Appropriation.

#### 5.2 Annual appropriations

No simple comparison of initial budget estimate and outcome for individual appropriation line items is possible in respect of annual appropriations from the Consolidated Fund. There are several reasons for this. First, by convention, individual items in the budget estimates do not include allowance for payments in respect of wage awards which may be handed down during the year. (Section 4 (2) of the Appropriation Act authorizes the Treasurer to provide the necessary additional appropriation for such wage awards and amounts so appropriated are incorporated in the appropriations reported in the Treasurer's Finance Statement issued at the end of that year.) Second, at the program level, section 10 of the Appropriation Act authorizes the Treasurer to transfer funds between programs under the same Department. (Particulars of such transfers are detailed in the Treasurer's Finance Statement issued at the end of that year.)

In addition, Program No. 729 "Advance to Treasurer" covers the provision of an amount by way of an advance to the Treasurer to enable him to allocate funds to Departments to cover urgent expenditures. This program enables provision to be made in the Budget for the estimated cash requirements for salary awards estimated for the year, and allowance for unforeseen increases in other areas of expenditure.

A single total amount is appropriated to the Treasurer's Advance in the Budget and the detailed spending is reported to Parliament in the following financial year. The spending from Treasurer's Advance is included in the actual spending against the departmental programs to which it has been charged.

Because of these provisions, care must be taken when comparisons are made between budgeted and actual expenditures for a particular year. It is possible, for example, for section 10 transfers between programs to cancel each other, so that agency expenditure is close to budget, even if particular program expenditure is not.

Pages 116-120 of Finance show payment variations due to use of Treasurer's Advance and transfers approved by the Treasurer under section 10 of the Appropriation Act, but provision of funds for wage awards approved by the Treasurer under section 4 (2) of the Appropriation Act and transfers approved pursuant to section 25 of the Audit Act by the Governor in Council are not separately identified in the tables.

#### 5.2.1 Budget Variations

Explanations are given below for some of the significant variations in actual annual program and item appropriations relative to budgeted amounts.

Payments from the Budget to the Hospitals and Charities Fund on account of public hospitals including nursing homes etc. exceeded the amount originally provided in the Budget by \$102.1 million. This amount mainly reflected the cost of wage awards for nurses and other Health professionals including the greater than budgeted cost of the nurses' career structure. In addition further funding was necessary to cover a shortfall in the targeted savings originally planned in the Budget in the public hospitals area and a shortfall in expected revenue from patient fees.

The Government retains some capital funds in each year's Budget in the Capital Development Fund to allow for expenditure during the year on new major capital projects which meet specified economic and social criteria but which are not finalised in time to be given a specific allocation in the Budget. To facilitate consideration of competing demands for funds, the Treasurer invites post-Budget submissions from Ministers during the financial year for new major project funding for either budget or non budget sector agencies. Consistent with capital budgeting processes, Ministers are required to include details of evaluation studies for such projects and these are considered by Cabinet. Allocations are reserved for major projects, although expenditure on these projects may not be very significant within the first year. The budget estimate was \$79.4 million, and actual payments were \$62.9 million. The underspending reflected a lower rate of spending on such projects than expected.

Program No. 333, "Youth Guarantee" was underexpended by \$7.211 million reflecting strengthening youth employment and a greater than budgeted lag between recruitment and associated claims for payments.

Payments made under Program No. 582, "Police Corporate Services" were increased by \$3.781 million by means of Treasurer Advance to cover payments in lieu of long service leave consequent to passing of the Emergency Services Superannuation Scheme.

Program No. 726, "Transfer and Other Payments" Item 3617, showed over expenditure of \$9.254 million as a result of higher than budgeted payments to cover the runout of workers compensation claims prior to introduction of WorkCare.

On the other hand, Item 3618 Payments of Fringe Benefits Tax under Program No. 726, was underexpended by \$3.113 million relative to budget. The budget estimate was based on information available at the time of preparation of the Budget, but actual expenditure was reduced as a result of legislative change.

Transport Program No. 684, Item 5025, "Transfer, Redeployment and Redundancy Package", was underexpended by \$9.237 million due to fewer employees than expected being included in the program during the financial year.

Program No. 726, Item 3549 expenditure was increased by \$5.142 million. The appropriation was increased to cover a higher than estimated rebate to the SECV in respect of electricity supplied to Alcoa under the terms of the flexible tariff deed.

#### 6. Accounting Policies and Practice

There are two generally accepted bases of accounting. One is the cash basis, by which income is taken into account in the period it is received and expenditure is accounted for when the actual disbursement is made. The other is the accrual basis under which revenue is brought to account as it is earned or due (even if not collected) and expenditure is recorded when a liablility is incurred (whether payment is made during the period or not). Some systems use elements of both bases. In most Westminster Parliamentary systems, as in Victoria, the basis of accounting is the cash basis. The Treasurer's Statement is prepared on a cash basis, with the exception of accounting for salaries, wages and pensions, in respect of which account is taken of the incurred cost of these items for the full year. Additional information with respect to certain assets and liabilities equity investments, borrowings and contingent liabilities, is included in Supplementary Information to the Statement.

During the 1986-87 financial year, a review of several aspects of the financial information provided to Parliament was conducted by the Department of Management and Budget. The objective of this review was to examine the information provided in order to eliminate duplication where possible and to make the form of that information more useful. The impetus for the review arose from the fact that the format of the Treasurer's Finance Statement had not been modified to take account of the information now provided to Parliament under the Annual Reporting Act 1983 ("the Act").

Pursuant to the requirements of the Act and the Annual Reporting (Administrative Unit) Regulations 1984 each administrative unit is required to table an annual report in Parliament containing a report of operations and financial statements. The financial statements include details of receipts and expenditure from all sources including Consolidated Fund and Trust Fund transactions. The passing of the Act marked a significant change in responsibility for reporting to Parliament by administrative units and set the scene for the translation of the Treasurer's Finance Statement into a more summary statement. Under the provisions of the Audit Act 1958, however, the Treasurer is still required to report in detail on Consolidated Fund and Trust Fund transactions.

#### 6.1 Review of Finance

The focus of the review described above was therefore to begin the reform of the Treasurer's Finance Statement to place it in the modern context of individual responsibility of each Minister and chief administrator for reporting the operating and financial activities of each administrative unit to Parliament. This theme provides the opportunity for the Treasurer's Finance Statement to concentrate upon aggregated information primarily relating to the budget sector.

Following the above review, a number of reforms have been included in the Statement for 1986–87, consistent with current provisions of the *Audit Act* 1958. These are the first of a series of proposed reforms to improve the effectiveness of the Statement as an essential element of the accountability process and as an aid to economic decision making.

The reforms included in the Statement are:

- (a) Greater explanation of significant variations between budgeted and actual revenue and expenditure;
- (b) Improved comparability with Appropriation Legislation through more consistent classification and levels of detail in reporting;
- (c) Grouping of like items into one place in the Statement where appropriate;
- (d) Inclusion of a summary of total public sector debt as well as aggregated information with respect to budget sector debt;
- (e) Reporting total expenditure for each program. In the past, Special Appropriations and Trust Fund expenditure were not allocated to

specific programs in the Finance Statement, although Budget Papers have presented information of this type for a number of years. This has been done in Finance for the first time this year and there are some classification differences between this Statement and the Budget Papers as explained in the text on page 5;

(f) Inclusion of certain asset and liability information derived from data included in annual reports of administrative units. This summary provides aggregated information with respect to the levels of debtors, creditors and stores on hand for the budget sector as a whole at 30 June 1987.

In addition to these reforms, the Treasurer proposes to seek Parliamentary approval for elimination of duplication of detailed program information now reported comprehensively in the annual reports of administrative units. Amendment of the *Audit Act* 1958 will be required if more substantial reforms to Finance are to be made.

#### 6.2 Developments in Financial Management

Among the significant developments in accounting practice which have occurred in 1986-87 in the budget sector are three initiatives which directly affect this Statement or will do so in the future. First, the Comptroller-General issued Accounting Policy Statement No. 2 on Accounts Payable in response to the need for more timely payment of suppliers' accounts. The Government's initiatives in this regard have seen significant improvements in performance in this area, to the extent that the level of outstanding accounts payable has fallen by 10 per cent over the financial year. Cabinet now receives quarterly performance reports on payment of accounts and systems are being updated to automate payment on due date as well as controlling the flow of documentation.

Second, debt recovery guidelines were issued by the Comptroller-General in order to improve the recording and collection of amounts due to the State both within the budget sector and from the community more generally. Whilst overall performance in this area has improved over the last year, more work will be necessary, particularly in systems development.

Finally, the Treasurer has approved a major initiative to improve asset recording and reporting by budget sector agencies. This initiative, which will be developed over the next two years, is important because it is designed to provide improved information for resource allocation decisions and lead to more effective use of the State's resources and infrastructure.

#### 6.3 Consolidated Statement of Operations

In the Treasurer's Finance Statement for 1985–86 it was stated that a Consolidated Statement of Operations of the Public Account would be incorporated into the 1986–87 Statement. Such a Statement appears on page 1. Further development of this Statement will enhance its usefulness in informing the community about the overall financial operations of the Public Account.

One of the principal considerations receiving increasing attention is the case for complementing of the cash basis of accounting by provision of additional integrated information with respect to assets and liabilities. The asset and liability information presented in this Statement reflects developments in this area. Improved physical asset recording and reporting will enable further development in the future.

These initiatives will help provide an increasingly clear picture of the resources which the State is managing on behalf of the people of Victoria.

#### 7. Statutory Authorities and Agencies Reporting to the Treasurer

The above bodies prepare their own Annual Reports and therefore are not reported in Finance. Nevertheless issues involving these bodies which are considered to warrant a wider disclosure have been raised below. Further information on these bodies may be obtained from respective Annual Reports as they become available.

7.1 Transport Accident Commission/State Insurance Office

Outstanding Liability—Third Party Insurance Claims

During 1986-87 the Transport Accident Commission (TAC) was established and assumed all liabilities of the State Insurance Office (SIO) for Third Party Insurance related claims.

These were assumed in accordance with section 176 (4) of the *Transport* Accident Act 1986 which reads as follows:

"All liabilities of the State Insurance Office in its capacity as authorised insurer under Part V of the *Motor Car Act* 1958 immediately before the commencement of this section become, on that commencement, liabilities of the (Transport Accident) Commission.".

TAC arranged for an actuarial assessment of assumed liabilities as of 1 January 1987 based on expected operations under the *Transport Accident Act* 1986 and new administrative arrangements.

As part of the wind up of Third Party activities at the SIO that body arranged for an actuarial report to be prepared for Compulsory Third Party outstanding claims liabilities based upon the scheme as administered by the State Insurance Office. This figure will be significantly more than the figure supplied to the TAC by their actuaries. At time of finalisation of Finance audited figures for the SIO and TAC were not available.

There are a number of reasons for the difference. The major reasons, however, relate to the new arrangements established by the Government in the creation of the TAC. A significant part of the difference in the actuaries' reports, for example, relates to steps taken for administrative tightening of claims, reduction in the "care and attention" component of larger claims and an overall reduced rate allowed for expenses.

It must be recognised that the actuaries are attempting to provide an estimate of the present value of future payments of outstanding claims liabilities, and claims may be paid in some cases for periods in excess of ten years. Actuarial estimation methods must be employed in order to calculate the expected cost of claims before a result can be determined. Small differences in actuarial assumptions associated with timing of payments, rates of growth in claim payments and future expense rates can lead to significantly different actuarial results. The difference is in effect a one-off benefit arising from the reforms to the system and represents a reduction in the estimated value of outstanding motor accident claims at 31 December 1986. It is not considered appropriate that this gain should be considered to be profit in the accounts of either the TAC or the SIO.

It was agreed, following consultation between the Department of Management and Budget, State Insurance Office and the Transport Accident Commission that the most appropriate treatment was for the SIO and the TAC to use their respective actuary's figures in order to show the results in the six months of operation for each entity. This approach has the objective of ensuring that operations in each entity provide a result which reflects the true cost of operations for that body based on consistent methods of valuing outstanding claims. In addition to disclosure herewith, both organisations have agreed to appropriate disclosure of the actuarial estimates in their financial statements. 17
