NOTES TO THE TREASURER'S STATEMENT

1. General Comments

The law relating to the finances of the State of Victoria is contained in the Constitution Act, the Audit Act and the Public Account Act.

The Constitution Act creates the Consolidated Revenue and makes its appropriation the prerogative of Parliament. It also establishes the requirement that any money bill must be preceded by a message from the Governor, and that expenditure may be incurred only on warrants from the Governor.

The Audit Act relates to the financial administration of moneys coming into the hands of the Government; the collection, management and expenditure of, and the subsequent accounting for, these moneys, public property and other property. It covers the audit of public accounts, including departmental accounts, and the reporting to Parliament by the Auditor-General on the Treasurer's Statement.

The Public Account Act defines the scope of the Consolidated Fund and the Trust Fund, the balances of which are held in the Government's bank account—the Public Account. The Trust Fund includes the Works and Services Account, the Cash Management Account and the State Development Account. The Cash Management Account and the State Development Account form the Victorian Development Fund. The Public Account Act also permits the use of the Public Account for temporary advances for a number of purposes related to the needs of the Government and provides for investment of the Public Account in trustee securities. Provision is also made for temporary borrowings should the balance in the Consolidated Fund be insufficient to meet commitments during a financial year.

2. Treasurer's Statement

Section 46 of the Audit Act requires the Treasurer, not later than three months after the end of the financial year, to prepare a detailed statement of the receipts into, and expenditure from, the Consolidated Fund and the Trust Fund in the financial year and to transmit it to the Auditor-General.

Continuing new initiatives introduced in 1986 to improve presentation, all amounts defined in the Treasurer's Statement are expressed in \$'000.

The Treasurer's Statement is produced on a progressive basis and verified by the Auditor-General. When the Statement is completed and signed by the Treasurer, it is transmitted to the Auditor-General for presentation to Parliament in terms of section 47 of the Audit Act.

Broadly, the Treasurer's Statement for the 1988-89 financial year comprises—

A.—A statement of the balances of the State of Victoria as at 30 June 1989. This statement shows the aggregate transactions of and the balances of the Consolidated Fund and the Trust Fund, less certain advances from the Public Account (in terms of the Public Account Act) and how these balances were held in the form of bank balances and investments. (See page 1)

B.—Details of the year's receipts and payments in the Consolidated Fund.

The Consolidated Fund receipts as set out in section 4 of the Public Account Act comprise the Consolidated Revenue under the Constitution Act and all moneys received by the State under the Commonwealth and States' Financial Agreement Acts. They also include grants from the Commonwealth, amounts received from the sale of property and the repayment of loans made from the Works and Services Account.

Payments from the Consolidated Fund are appropriated by Parliament by virtue of the Constitution Act. There are two types of appropriation—Special and Annual.

Special Appropriations exist in legislation which appropriates moneys out of the Consolidated Fund for specific purposes and are of a continuing nature. These are set out in detail on pages 24–26.

Annual Appropriations are those appropriations passed by Parliament which are incorporated in the Appropriation Act for the supply of funds to meet approved recurrent and works and services expenditure for a financial year. Since the formal adoption of program budgeting by the Government in 1984-85 Parliamentary appropriations have been made to Ministry programs. The Annual Appropriation Act also provides the authority for the Treasurer to approve the transfer of allocations from one program to another within a Ministry, but not so between recurrent and works and services allocations. Recurrent and Works and Services expenditure approved by the Treasurer under Program No. 729 "Advance to Treasurer" are shown in column 5. Program 729 enables the Treasurer to meet urgent claims, prospective wage awards and other unforseen contingencies. Details are submitted to Parliament for approval in the following financial year as a schedule to the Annual Appropriation Act. Set out on pages 27-144 are the amounts appropriated by Parliament and the details of expenditure under Program 729 for each department. Funds to enable the Treasurer to meet urgent claims may also be provided temporarily out of the Public Account under section 16 of the Public Account Act and are subject to Parliamentary appropriation in the following year. These are also set out on pages 27–138.

Details of transfers made under section 10 of the Appropriation Act are included in the payments from the Consolidated Fund. These are shown in column 2 on pages 27-138 and show all variations to the Parliamentary Authority under the respective programs. A further statement of transfers by agency will be found on pages 139-143.

- C.—In respect of the Trust Fund, details are given of receipts into and payments from the trust fund together with the balances of the various funds and accounts which make up the Trust Fund, classified into a number of categories. The summary table of the Trust Fund also reflects movement details and comparative figures for last financial year. A list of the amounts of individual trust accounts which are invested, and details of the securities held by Trust Accounts, are also included.
- D.—In the 1986-87 financial year a major reform of the Finance Statement was made in the Supplementary Information consistent with improvements in reporting and suggestions by the Auditor-General. These included reporting payments by program whether from Annual or Special Appropriations, or the Trust Fund, inclusion of a summary

of Public Debt and the inclusion of summarised asset and liability information. This information is contained in the tables on pages 3-12 and 158-169.

3. Budget Out-turn for Financial Year

The table below shows in summary form actual receipts and payments of the Consolidated Fund for the year ended 30 June 1989, as well as budgeted amounts.

Financial transactions of the Consolidated Fund in 1988-89 were in balance, as shown above.

4. Current Account Receipts

4.1 Current Account Receipts

In his 1988-89 Budget the Treasurer estimated that total current account receipts would be \$10 168.6 million. Actual receipts during the year were \$10 265.0 million—\$96.4 million or 0.9 per cent above the Budget forecast.

⁽¹⁾ Certain expenditures met during the 1988-89 financial year as Special Appropriations pursuant to section 4 (3) of the *Public Account Act* 1958, were recorded as annual appropriations in Table A1 of Budget Paper No. 3 in accordance with normal practice, because they will be met from Annual Appropriations in 1989-90. In the above table they appear as Special Appropriations. These expenditures totalled: Recurrent, \$13-9 M and Works and Services, \$6-1 M.

⁽²⁾ In accordance with normal practice Budget estimates for recurrent annual appropriations do not include allowance for payments in respect of wage awards which may be handed down during the year. These totalled \$165.4 M in 1988-89 and are included in the recurrent appropriations of the respective Ministries as detailed in the abstract on pages 27-138. The total for recurrent annual appropriations including Section 4 (2) appropriations for 1988-89 is \$8 624.3 M.

Some of the major variations in revenue collections are discussed below. Further details on receipts from individual items can be found in the 1989-90 Budget Paper No. 4.

4.2 Taxation Receipts

Total receipts from State Taxation in 1988-89 were \$4531.7 million—\$185.2 million above the Budget forecast. Some of the major variations from Budget estimates are shown in the following table:

4.2.1 Pay-roll Tax

Receipts from Pay-roll tax in 1988-89 were \$1574.5 million—\$12.2 million or 0.8 per cent above the Budget estimate. This result reflects greater than anticipated increases in earnings and strong employment growth.

4.2.2 Stamp Duties

The area of greatest variation from the Budget estimate of receipts was in the area of stamp duty. In aggregate, revenue from stamp duties was \$183.7 million or 12.7 per cent above the Budget estimate.

Receipts from stamp duty on land transfers were \$961.4 million in 1988-89—\$321.5 million higher than collections in 1987-88. Activity in the property market in 1988-89 was at a very high level with an increase in the volume of transactions as well as an increase in the average price of properties.

Stamp duty receipts on motor vehicle transfers were \$219.1 million in 1988-89—\$18.4 million above the Budget estimate due in part to stronger than anticipated volumes of new registrations.

Paralleling the boom conditions in the property market in 1988-89, stamp duty receipts on mortgages exceeded Budget by \$17.6 million and stamp duty receipts on leases exceeded Budget by \$6.4 million.

Stamp duty receipts on transfers of marketable securities were only \$119.4 million in 1988-89—\$45.6 million below the Budget estimate of \$164.0 million. The extent and duration of the slowdown in the volume of transactions in the wake of the stock market crash of October 1987 was underestimated at the time of 1988-89 Budget.

4.2.3 Other Taxation Revenues

Revenue from Tattersalls duty was \$259.2 million in 1988-89, up \$10.1 million on 1987-88 but \$20 million below the Budget estimate. The shortfall on Budget was primarily due to a halt in revenue from Tattslotto subscriptions following three years of growth, and lower receipts than anticipated with the introduction of Keno.

Petroleum franchise fees amounted to \$228.1 million in 1988-89, \$20.8 million short of the Budget predictions due to an unanticipated fall in petrol prices linked directly to volatility of world oil prices and appreciation of the Australian exchange rate.

Liquor licence fees at \$114.2 million in 1988-89 exceeded Budget by \$11.0 million as revenues rose to reflect new licensing flexibility under the *Liquor Control Act* 1987.

Tobacco franchise fees were \$126.7 million in 1988-89, \$9.7 million up on Budget due to reduced interstate trade following the introduction of tobacco franchise fees in Queensland in December 1988, a policy decision announced by the Queensland Government after the Victorian Budget for 1988-89 was announced.

Other State taxes were largely on target with the Budget forecasts.

4.3 Other State Sources of Current Account Revenue

In aggregate, State sources of current account revenue, other than taxation and the drawdowns from the Cash Management Account, were \$1860.0 million—\$60.3 million below the Budget forecast. Major variations from Budget forecasts are set out below.

4.3.1 Recoveries of Debt

Actual receipts under this heading of revenue were \$300.6 million in 1988-89—\$25.9 million less than the Budget forecast of \$326.5 million. This shortfall was, in the main, due to a decision made during the year not to recall advances of \$21 million as budgeted.

4.3.2 Petroleum Royalties

Receipts from Petroleum Royalties in 1988-89 were \$93.6 million—\$28.0 million lower than the Budget forecast. The shortfall reflected a sharp decline in world oil prices over the course of the year, and a fall in production in response to lower prices.

4.3.3 Revenue from Fees and Charges

Total receipts from Departmental fees and charges in 1988-89 were \$344.3 million—\$9.7 million lower than the Budget forecast. Above Budget results recorded in Corporate Affairs Office fees and Land Titles Office fees were offset by shortfalls in fees for interagency services.

4.3.4 Miscellaneous Revenues

Total receipts under the heading of Miscellaneous Revenues were \$208.5 million in 1988-89—\$35.5 million above the Budget estimate.

Receipts from interest on public account were \$17.6 million—\$4.6 million above Budget due to improved cash management enabling maximum investment of balances and higher than anticipated interest rates throughout the year.

Miscellaneous receipts also include receipt of a payment of \$14.1 million from the Flexible Tariff Management Unit Trust.

4.3.5 Receipts from Commonwealth Sources

Total recurrent receipts from all Commonwealth sources were \$3839.8 million in 1988-89—\$33.8 million above the Budget forecast of \$3806.0 million.

The largest single receipt into the Consolidated Fund from the Commonwealth is the Financial Assistance Grant paid to Victoria. At the 1985 Premiers Conference it was agreed that in 1986–87 and 1987–88 Financial Assistance Grants payable to all States would be increased by two per cent in real terms. States also received health grants based on the two per cent real growth factor. The 1986–87 grants were determined in accordance with these arrangements but in 1987–88 the Commonwealth removed the legislated two per cent real guarantee and increased the general revenue grants only to maintain zero real growth. In 1988–89, the Commonwealth imposed a cut of \$650 million to the forward estimates of general revenue which would have otherwise maintained zero real growth in these payments.

The distribution of general revenue assistance for 1988-89 is partially in accordance with the relativities assessed by the Commonwealth Grants Commission in its report on General Revenue Grant Relativities 1988. One departure from the recommended relativities was that the Commonwealth decided that no State would receive less in general revenue grants in 1988-89 than it had in 1987-88. This resulted in special revenue assistance totalling \$88 million being provided to Western Australia, South Australia, Tasmania, and Northern Territory, funded by a corresponding reduction in the share of the other States.

4.3.6 Works and Services Receipts

Works and Services receipts totalled \$1977.3 million compared to a Budget estimate of \$2038.5 million, a downward variation from budget of \$61.2 million. The major areas of variation were a shortfall in receipts from Asset Sales, which were \$29.6 million below the Budget estimate, and the transfer from the Works

and Services Account was less than budgeted by \$43-1 million. The lower than estimated transfer from the Works and Services Account reflects lower than budgeted works and services payments. The budget sector global limit borrowings were \$880-9 million in 1988–89. These borrowings are paid into the Works and Services Account, and transferred as required to the Consolidated Fund to meet works and services expenditure. Because works and services payments were lower than budgeted, the transfer to the Consolidated Fund was lower than budgeted, so that there was a balance in the Works and Services Account of \$53-8 million at 30 June 1989.

4.3.7 Asset Sales Receipts and Works and Services Expenditure

As shown on page 6 of table B1 of Budget Paper No. 3, *The Consolidated Fund 1989-90*, receipts from Asset Sales form part of works and services receipts. These receipts are applied for works and services purposes as approved by the Parliament detailed in Budget Paper No. 3.

No hypothecation of the receipts from the sale of assets is made and it is not possible to identify particular works and services receipts from Asset Sales or other sources with any particular works and services projects.

5. Payments

Recurrent payments exceeded the budget estimate by \$96.4 million. Works and Services payments fell short of the Budget Estimate by \$61.2 million.

5.1 Special Appropriations

Special appropriations exceeded the Budget by \$44.6 million. An amount of \$20.0 million, reflecting Commonwealth money additional to that expected at Budget, was expended with the appropriation authority provided under section 4 (3) of the Public Account Act.

In addition pensions exceeded Budget by \$20.3 million, mainly as a result of a greater than forecast number of early retirements, whilst accrued interest received during the year as an element of the proceeds of borrowings exceeded the amount included in the Budget by \$14.5 million.

5.2 Annual Appropriations

No simple comparison of initial budget estimate and outcome for individual appropriation line items is possible in respect of annual appropriations from the Consolidated Fund. There are several reasons for this. First, by convention, individual items in the budget estimates do not include allowance for payments in respect of wage awards which may be handed down during the year. (Section 4 (2) of the Appropriation Act authorises that the Treasurer may provide the necessary additional appropriation for such wage awards and amounts so appropriated are incorporated in the appropriations reported in the Treasurer's Finance Statement issued at the end of that year.) Second, at the program level, section 10 of the Appropriation Act authorises the Treasurer to transfer funds between programs under the same Department.

In addition, Program No. 729 "Advance to Treasurer" covers the provision of an amount by way of an advance to the Treasurer to enable him to allocate funds to Departments to cover urgent expenditures. This program enables provision to be made in the Budget for the estimated cash requirements for salary awards estimated for the year, and allowance for unforeseen increases in other areas of expenditure.

A single total amount is appropriated to the Treasurer's Advance in the Budget and the detailed spending is reported to Parliament in the following financial year. The spending from this Advance to Treasurer, together with expenditure authorised pursuant to section 16 of the Public Account Act as well as spending authorised under sections 4 (2) and 10 of the Appropriation Act is included in the actual spending against the departmental programs to which it has been charged.

Because of these provisions, care must be taken when comparisons are made between budgeted and actual expenditures for a particular year. It is possible, for example, for section 10 transfers between programs to cancel each other, so that agency expenditure is close to budget, even if particular program expenditure is not.

Pages 27-144 of Finance show payment variations due to use of Treasurer's Advance and transfers approved by the Treasurer under section 10 of the Appropriation Act, but provision of funds for wage awards approved by the Treasurer under section 4 (2) of the Appropriation Act and transfers approved pursuant to section 25 of the Audit Act by the Governor in Council are not separately identified in the tables.

5.2.1 Budget Variations

Explanations are given below for some of the significant variations in actual annual program and item appropriations relative to budgeted amounts.

Payments from the Budget to the Hospital and Charities Fund for payments to public hospitals, nursing homes, etc. exceeded the amount provided in the Budget by \$69.7 million. Of this amount \$62.9 million relates to wage awards of which the most significant were the National Wage decisions handed down during the 1988–89 financial year.

It will be noted that the amount provided uner Program 400.3170—Contributions to the Hospital and Charities Fund, exceeded Budget by \$99.0 million. Because of the nature of the accounting arrangements for the transfer of Totalizator and Tattersalls revenue to the Hospital and Charities Fund if the amount available falls below Budget it is necessary to make this good by increasing the annual appropriation. At the time of the Budget it was expected that \$357.1 million would be paid into the Fund from the proceeds of Totalizator and Tattersalls revenue. In the event the amount available was \$327.8 million it was therefore necessary to provide, through the annual appropriation, \$29.3 million. This is not additional expenditure but rather a change in sourcing for the Hospital and Charities Fund.

In the case of Education the major increase in expenditure relates to salaries where they exceeded Budget by \$81.6 million. Award costs account for \$45.5 million of this expenditure whilst the remainder resulted from a slower than anticipated implementation of savings measures, the cost of additional teachers to meet higher than expected enrolments and the effect of increased recoups to revenue which are reflected in expenditure.

In addition the expenditure under Program 297.2911 was \$310.0 million, an increase above the Budget of \$11.8 million of which \$7.9 million relates to wage awards handed down during the year.

In Conservation, Forests and Lands it was necessary to provide for additional spending of \$7.6 million under Program 208.2619 in respect of a contribution to the Fisheries Research Trust Account. It was necessary to establish this Trust Account to comply with Commonwealth funding requirements and the amount provided is offset by equivalent revenues and is therefore at no net cost to the Budget.

The same situation exists in respect of the \$4.1 million, expenditures under Program 726.3662 the payment made in respect of the winding up of the Public Trustee Office. i.e. the expenditure is offset by revenue.

Significant over expenditure of \$9.5 million occurred in respect of the payment of rents through the Department of Property and Services. This additional expenditure was required in the main to cover additional rental payments which were necessary following major rental reviews, primarily in the central business district.

In the case of Transport it was necessary to provide a further \$9.2 million for transfer, redeployment and redundancy programs within the Transport portfolio. In addition, in the case of the Metropolitan Transit Authority a further \$6.8 million was required to meet greater than expected expenditure in the acquisition of new rolling stock and the Epping Decentralization Project.

In the Budget for the 1988-89 financial year the Government allocated \$66.6 million for expenditure under the Capital Development Fund. In the event \$38.3 million only was expended and this is the primary reason there was an under expenditure under the Works and Services Sector of the Consolidated Fund of \$61.2 million.

Payments made under Program No. 726, Financing Charges, Item 3610 were \$31.9 million less than Budget. This reduction in debt servicing payments arose from changed management procedures implemented during the 1988-89 financial year.

From the Works and Services Sector of the Consolidated Fund an amount of \$5.0 million was expended in relation to the winding up of the Victorian Public Offices Corporation.

6. Accounting Developments and Initiatives

6.1 Developments in Cash Management

The fundamental principles underlying cash management in the budget sector are:

- centralised cash management collection arrangements; and
- funding of outflows on a needs basis.

The State's banking business is conducted through an account styled "Public Account" and is maintained with the undermentioned banks:

- Australia and New Zealand Banking Group Ltd.
- National Australia Bank Ltd.
- State Bank Victoria: and
- Westpac Banking Corporation Ltd.

All public moneys payable to the public account are either credited directly to that bank account by Receivers of Revenue or paid to DMB by Collectors of Imposts. All payments from the Public Account are either made directly from the

account or through advance accounts operated by administrative units and budget sector agencies.

In order to assist agencies applying modern cash management techniques to the operation of the Public Account, policy circulars and guidelines have been issued requesting reviews of present practices and improvement where appropriate. The aim of these requests is to concentrate cash in the Public Account rather than allowing small amounts to lie idle in a multiplicity of decentralised locations. Also, funds available for short term investment are maximised and daily funding requirements can be monitored and met in a controlled and efficient fashion with the Public Account Portfolio Manager at the Victorian Development Fund.

Circulars issued have specifically requested administrative units to:

- Reimburse their expenditure from the Public Account only to the extent necessary to meet cheque presentation;
- Ensure that advantage is taken of discounts offered by suppliers when appropriate;
- Review the timing of payments to organisations which are fully or partially funded from the Public Account so that payments are made to meet the needs of those organisations; and
- Examine all bank accounts under their control with the object of transferring funds not required for immediate use to the Public Account until current needs arise.

During 1988-89 major improvements have taken place in the timely receipt of moneys to the Public Account. With minor exceptions, all moneys collected throughout the State are paid to the Public Account on the same day or the day after receipt of the money.

This has been largely achieved by utilising advanced banking technology and the centralisation of revenue bank accounts. As an example, all Clerks of Magistrates' Courts throughout the State pay their revenue collections to the Attorney-General's Revenue Account in Melbourne and the Attorney-General's Department transfers the total collections to DMB. To avoid delays in identifying the appropriate revenue heads for which the funds are collected, a Revenue Suspense Account has been established in the Trust Fund to which all funds are initially transferred. Periodical transfers from the Suspense Account are made, by journal entry, when the correct Revenue or Trust credits have been identified. Similar arrangements have been made for a number of other departments.

As part of the overall improvement in better managing the cash resources of the State an integrated computerised cash management system has been established in DMB. The system allows for:

- central monitoring of account balances;
- transaction detail of the Public Account; and
- interface of information with the Public Account Cash Book for reconciliation purposes.

6.2 Developments in Accounts Receivable and Credit Management

During the year, 1986 DMB "Guidelines for the recovery of outstanding debts" were translated into an Accounting Policy Statement—"Accounts Receivable and Credit Management APS3".

The Statement provides policy guidelines to agencies in order to increase the emphasis on information about credit management and accounts receivable in the Victorian Public Sector.

The statement requires:

- sound procedures to be in place to check the credit worthiness of customers/ clients, where appropriate, to minimise the loss of revenue to the State;
- timely recognition and recording of accounts receivable;
- a financial management information system should be maintained to manage all aspects of accounts receivable;
- reconciliation of agency's accounts receivable records and customer/client records; and
- adequate reporting mechanisms to inform management at least monthly on accounts receivable performance of the agency together with a quarterly report to Cabinet.

6.3 Developments in Accounts Payable and Risk Management

From 3 April 1989, the Treasury Regulations 1981 were amended to provide for a reduction in the level of checking of accounts less than \$1000. The amendments still require accounts less than \$1000 to be authorised for payment but revoked the requirement for the formal certification of the expenditure. There will however be no less documentation to support the payment as the invoice, order and material received voucher will be attached, where applicable, and the account will have been effectively certified as:

- funds sufficiency would have been verified; and
- the purchase would have been made in terms of the regulations or other approved mechanisms.

To manage the element of risk introduced into the accounts payable process the Treasurer has instructed agencies to ensure, on a sample basis, that accounts less than \$1000 have been properly authorised. DMB provided agencies with Sampling Guidelines to assist them in carrying out the Treasurer's instruction.

In addition, DMB issued guidelines to assist agencies to manage any perceived risks associated with the changed process and it is the responsibility of each agency to ensure that adequate internal controls have been established and are operating effectively.

6.4 Developments in purchasing by Corporate Card

The major initiative taken to ensure that the creditors of the State are paid on a timely basis was the introduction of the State Government Corporate Card on 3 April 1989.

The major benefits flowing from the introduction of the Corporate Card are seen as:

- allowing the State's suppliers to receive speedier payment;
- reducing paperwork for both the State and its suppliers;
- reducing the number of payments processed by departments/agencies;
- assisting the State's cash management; and
- productivity gains to agencies/government.

The Corporate Card is an ANZ Visa Business Card which bears the Coat of Arms of the State, the name of the agency and the officer.

The Corporate Card has two features which allows for the deduction of sales tax at the point of sale, namely:

• a dedicated number approved by the Australian Taxation Office; and

• the words "Purchases on this card are exempt from Sales Tax" on the reverse of the Card.

The Corporate Card can be used to purchase goods and services up to \$1000 in a single transaction and can be used for over the counter, telephone or mail order purchases.

Settlement of the agency's monthly statement is effected by direct debit by the bank to the agency's nominated bank account.

As with other accounts less than \$1000 Corporate Card transactions must be checked on a sample basis, to ensure that they have been properly authorised.

Treasury Regulations 1981 have been amended to give effect to the use of the Corporate Card and DMB have issued Guidelines to assist agencies to manage the operations of the Corporate Card.

6.5 Developments in Human Resource Management

The requirement for greater accountability of Departments and Statutory Authorities has led to greater demands being placed on the skills of finance managers and their staff throughout the Victoria Public Sector.

DMB has supported the PSB in the development of specialised training programs. These include:

- Finance skills for program managers;
- Government accounting for finance officers; and
- Senior finance managers program.

These programs have been developed and improved over the past two years in consultation with Agencies. Finance skills for program managers is being conducted during 1989 by the Public Sector Management Institute at Monash University.

The Comptroller General has ensured that, as a matter of policy the introduction of new initiatives which are developed within his division will be supported by adequate training and development programs. In line with this policy the following initiatives were taken during 1988–89:

- The Corporate card initiative together with the reduced checking arrangements for accounts of \$1000 or less, was launched by a state-wide training program.
- The issue at APS3 on Accounts Receivable and Credit Management was supported by a training program conducted in July 1989.
- The quarterly publication "finet" continues to be a valuable communication link between DMB, Agencies and those interested in public sector issues.
- The PSB was engaged to develop a training manual for use by agencies in training Accounts Payable Staff.

6.6 Developments in Accounting Policy

6.6.1 Annual Reporting

As in 1987-88, substantial developments occurred with respect to the coverage of the *Annual Reporting Act* 1983 during 1988-89.

Fifty-two post-secondary education institutions and one hundred and fortytwo public hospitals were brought under the Act and will prepare their annual reports in accordance with the Annual Reporting (Contributed Income Sector) Regulations 1988. In addition, a large number of other bodies will now prepare their annual reports in accordance with these Regulations or, in some cases, the Annual Reporting (Business Undertakings) Regulations 1988.

The Annual Reporting (Administrative Units) Regulations 1985 and the Annual Reporting (Contributed Income Sector) Regulations 1988 were also amended during the year.

6.6.2 Asset Recording and Reporting

A position paper on asset valuation was completed during 1988-89. The paper's position is that non-current physical assets should be valued at written down current cost. It is expected that an Accounting Policy Statement on Asset Recording and Reporting will be issued during 1989-90. The implementation of this policy will lead to the provision of information which can enhance the management of the public sector's resources.

6.7 Development of Internal Audit

Internal audit is seen by the Government as a Key Management Control which operates principally by keeping management informed regarding the adequacy of all other internal management practices and controls.

It was for this reason that in September 1987 the Government supported the establishment of an adequate internal audit function in every public sector organisation and issued a requirement that all budget sector administrative units establish and maintain an adequate internal audit function.

In association with this initiative the Department of Management and Budget issued guidelines entitled "Internal Audit in the Victorian Public Sector—An Introduction to the Function of Management and Staff" to describe the role and scope of the internal audit function and the features necessary for its effective operation.

In December 1988, the Government required further action to be taken to ensure that all major statutory authorities and Government controlled companies establish an adequate internal audit function and an audit committee of the Board.

The release in January 1989 of the "Victorian Public Sector Internal Audit Manual" provided minimum standards and guidelines for the conduct of internal audit within the public sector, ensuring that internal audit units provide an appropriate level of assistance to the organisations' management. This manual is being supplemented with further technical guidelines.

In 1989 the Department of Management and Budget commenced providing chief administrators of budget sector administrative units with information regarding its views of Government priorities with relevance to internal audit. This information is being provided to assist chief administrators in the planning of their annual internal audit programs.

6.8 Financial and Resource Management

6.8.1 Financial Management Systems

The majority of administrative units now have their financial management systems maintained internally either using the mainstream system, FM80, or other in-house systems. To date, 23 administrative units have been upgraded to

the FM80 system with the assistance of DMB and another 2 intending to implement the system this financial year.

Agencies are now using FM80 more effectively and are interfacing other satellite systems. The needs of financial managers for financial information have also increased reflecting the increased responsibility and accountability placed on management at the agency level.

As FM80 had been centrally selected in 1984, it is intended to develop a plan to address either replacing or upgrading the system to meet the increased needs of Agencies. The plan is dependent upon the Government Resource Management Systems (GRMS) Strategy which is currently being developed to guide the evolution of computerised GRMS in the 1990's.

6.8.2 Human Resource Management Systems

The PERSPAY project was implemented with the goal of developing an efficient Human Resource Management System (HRMS) which would eradicate the inefficiencies inherent in the current separate personnel and payroll systems. PERSYST (personnel) and PAYCOST (payroll) are the two most commonly used HRMS within the Budget Sector. However, they were developed and exist independently of each other.

One of the first outputs from the PERSPAY project was the HRMS Standard which details minimum functional standards for any new personnel/payroll system being implemented in Budget Sector agencies. The philosophy behind the standard is that there should only be one data entry point for any personnel data needed for payroll calculation and production; i.e. there should be no manual transcription of data from any other system to the payroll system.

The PERS modules of the PERSPAY system are currently available in Prime INFORMATION and Advanced Revelation computer operating environments. It is hoped they will also be available in Universe and Generic Pick computing environments by the end of 1989. These modules meet the HRMS Standards for Personnel, Establishment, and Leave management.

Automatic interfaces to two bureau payroll systems are currently being developed. It is planned for these interfaces to be available by March 1990.

Eleven Budget Sector agencies have currently ordered the PERS modules and intend using one of the two payroll systems currently being interfaced to them. The Public Service Board intends replacing PERSYST with PERSPAY once the Consolidated (central) Data Base (CDB) has been fully tested. The phased introduction of PERSPAY CDB has been planned to commence by the end of 1989 and will be fully operational by the end of the 1989–90 financial year. In addition, it is also planned for the PAYCOST payroll system to be decommissioned with agencies transferring to either of the two payroll bureaux or any other provided it can be cost justified. Substantial savings are expected to accrue due to better and more accessible management information available from PERSPAY, and the eradication of manual data transcription from personnel to payroll systems.

6.8.3. Resource Management Systems Standards

Resource Management Systems Standards are required to ensure that systems implemented within the Budget Sector are consistent, which in turn will enhance overall completeness, reliability and comparability of data used to manage the State's resources. These standards can also be used as the basis for the development of the functional requirements of agencies.

System standards will continue to be developed and updated for systems relating to the general management of financial, human, physical and information resources. In addition, a resource document on general systems requirements applicable across all resource management systems' selection and implementation will be issued as part of the strategy.

Resource Management Systems Standards issued to date are Human Resource Management Standards (August 1987), the Exposure Draft on Financial Systems (October 1987) covering areas of general ledger, accounts receivable and accounts payable, WorkCare (October 1988) and Asset Recording and Reporting (January 1989). Others that are currently being finalised are standards for Cash Management, General System Requirements, Accounts Receivable and Payroll. It is planned to develop and issue updated standards for the General Ledger, Accounts Payable and Purchase Order this financial year.

Establishing resource management systems standards is only a part of the process to improve resource management systems in the Victorian Public Service. The ultimate responsibility for improvements rest with each agency in its implementation of these standards.

 - It should be noted that specific guarantees are generally provided as secondary securities. This requires the lenders to exercise all means available to exhaust their claims against the borrowers in respect of primary securities held prior to claiming the government guarantee.
- (2) To avoid double counting, borrowings by Victorian Public Authorities Finance Agency ("VicFin") which were guaranteed by the Government have been recorded against the authorities ultimately receiving the funds. The amount outstanding as at 30 June 1989 was \$7.797.1m.
 - Of the total borrowings still outstanding as at 30 June 1989, \$5 393.3 m was onlent to Capital Works Authority for capital works for the State.
 - As at 30 June 1989, an amount of \$676.8 m was still held by VicFin as arrangements had not been finalized for the onlending of these funds to the various authorities.
- (3) Every policy, contract or arrangement of Insurance made by the State Insurance Office is guaranteed by the Government of Victoria. The amount outstanding as at 30 June 1989 was \$385.7m.
- (4) With the exception of borrowings made by the Gas and Fuel Corporation of Victoria, all the contingent liabilities supplied by the above bodies have not been audited at the time these figures were compiled.
- (5) All liabilities previously shown under Decentralized Industries Housing Authority and Housing Commission are now shown under the Ministry of Housing and Construction.
- (6) The Grain Elevators Board has both statutory and specific guarantees.
- (7) Liabilities incurred by the State Bank, including deposits made with the Bank, are guaranteed by the Government of Victoria.
