Movement and place classifications


Movement and place classifications are grouped into road and street types that have similar activities. These classifications give further detail about the movement and place role the road has.

Each movement classification has transport mode types that represent the various movements on roads, like buses, freight, walking and general traffic.

Place classifications are defined by state-level planning such as Plan Melbourne. They consider on and off-street land uses, like parks and shopping centres.

Figure D1 demonstrates how movement and place classifications come together to define how important a road or street is based on how it is used.
